“Joseph her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly.”

At a men’s retreat, the priest who was the retreat master told the men present that Saint Joseph was a perfect model for them to imitate as fathers and husbands in their families. One man responded cynically that it was hard to associate with Saint Joseph, because he was a saint, his wife, Mary, was sinless, and his son, Jesus, was God. The man went on to say that he was far from being a saint, his wife was also a sinner, and his child was not the Son of God. But the retreat master challenged him and pointed out that all men could learn to *trust* like Saint Joseph, which is really at the heart of why he is a perfect model for them as husbands and fathers. When Saint Joseph could not understand initially that his wife Mary was pregnant by the Holy Spirit, he still trusted and divorced her quietly, rather than expose her to the harshness of the law. Saint Joseph also had to trust when the Holy Family had to flee King Herod and go to Egypt, where they were migrants, making it difficult for them to find shelter and employment. Lastly, when the child Jesus could not be found in the caravan on the way back from Jerusalem, for three days Saint Joseph had to trust that God would help him find his son. So, Saint Joseph is the perfect role model for husbands and fathers, because they must trust in God's providence every day, as they provide for their families and more importantly, guide them in the ways of faith. *Saint Joseph, pray for fathers to trust less in their own abilities and more in the power of God's grace.*

Difficult Scripture Passages

“While He was still speaking to the crowds, His mother and His brothers appeared outside, wishing to speak with Him” (Matthew 12:47).

Regarding the virginity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, “The deepening of faith in the virginal motherhood led the Church to confess Mary’s real and perpetual virginity, even in the act of giving birth to the Son of God made man. And so, the liturgy of the Church celebrates Mary as *Aeiparthenos*, the Ever Virgin” (499). Against this doctrine, we must raise the objection that the Bible clearly mentions the brothers of Jesus. It thus appears that Church teaching contradicts the Sacred Scriptures, unless one understands the meaning of “brother” in the Scriptures.

In our contemporary understanding, a brother is a sibling, someone who shares the same biological parent or parents. But in the Sacred Scriptures, a brother (*adelphos*) also refers to a cousin or some broad relationship that cannot be equated with the bond forged by direct blood relationship or marriage. We witness this in both the Old and New Testaments, as in Hebrews 2: 11, which states, “He (Jesus) who consecrates and those who are being consecrated all have one origin. Therefore, He is not ashamed to call them brothers.”

That the brothers referred to in the above passage were really cousins, or some distant relation, has always been the common teaching of the Catholic Church. In fact, early Protestant reformers, namely Martin Luther and John Calvin, also held to Mary’s perpetual virginity and therefore did not consider the brothers of Jesus to be true siblings. Jesus is Mary’s only son, but her spiritual motherhood extends to all men whom indeed He came to save.

Prepare a Place in Your Soul for Christ at Christmas: When Jesus first came into our world at Bethlehem, He did not receive a great welcome. He was reduced to being born in a stable, a filthy environment, surrounded by animals. I hope this Christmas we can welcome Him in a much better way. The best way is to go to confession, to be in the state of grace, so that our pure and holy soul may welcome our Savior with immense joy and honor. This **Sunday, December 21st**, Father Bruce Krebs and I will be offering the Sacrament of Penance in our parishes: at **Sacred Heart**, confessions will be heard from **2:00 PM to 4:00 PM** and at **Saint Ann’s** from **6:30 PM to 8:00 PM**. May God move your hearts to be in the state of grace this Christmas, to provide a worthy dwelling place for the Son of God.

A Blessed Christmas to All: As we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, our Savior, this week, please know that you and your families will be in my prayers, especially before the creche. May the light of the Christ Child brighten the darkest moments of your life and fill your homes with His light and peace. May Christmas always be reminder of the profound truth that God loved this world so much that He sent His only Son, Jesus, to be born among us. May the Christ Child bless you and your families with the abundance of His love and grace. A blessed Christmas to one and all and may the peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you now and always.
