"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." Saint Theresa of Calcutta (aka, Mother Theresa) worked among the poorest of the poor. One day, in a spiritual conference to her sisters, she spoke of the second beatitude, "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." By mourning, she explained that Christians are to be sensitive to the sorrow and sufferings of others. With this weighing heavily upon their hearts and minds, they would do anything to lighten and carry the heavy crosses of others. In doing so, not only do we help relieve the sufferings of others, but we are happy in knowing that we did so in the name of Jesus. This insight of Saint Teresa of Calcutta might make me more sensitive to sorrow in the lives of people around me. What might I do to make it lighter? We should remember the adage: love locked in our hearts is like a letter written and not sent.

Difficult Scripture Passages

***"And Jesus grew in wisdom and in grace, and in favor with God and man"* (Luke 2:52).**

As Christians, we believe that the gift of eternal life with God demands moral and spiritual perfection; we must daily grow in grace and in holiness. But if the Gospel of Saint Luke is correct in speaking of Jesus' "growth in wisdom and grace," are we to assume that in some manner, Jesus was not morally and spiritually perfect? Was He not the holy one of God? Did He not possess infinite grace? How do we understand Saint John when he writes that Jesus "was full of grace and truth; from His fullness we have all received grace upon grace" (John 1:14-16).

Saint Thomas Aquinas assists us in making sense of this difficult Scripture passage by offering the important distinction of the two ways for an individual to grow in wisdom and grace. The first is in the habit of wisdom and grace, meaning human reflections, efforts, and actions nurtured and prompted by God's grace which lead a person to greater levels of virtue and holiness. In this sense, Jesus Christ did not grow; He was perfect in holiness from all eternity. The second way to grow in wisdom and grace is regarding the effects, that is inasmuch as a person produces wiser and greater effects. In this way, Jesus grew in wisdom and grace since in the course of His time on earth, He did more and greater works, effects such as healings, exorcisms, and raising people from the dead, which culminated in the greatest of His works, the Resurrection. Jesus's growth in grace is merely a way to express that His power as God was gradually revealed in His lifetime on earth, which will continue forever in the glory of heaven. As God, Jesus is infinite and in Heaven, we will never come to the end of exploring His grace and goodness. It will be a story of love, which will unfold for all eternity.

Padre's Picks: Know that you are welcome to the rectory at Sacred Heart in Glen Ullin, Father Gary's residence, On **Friday, February 13th, at 7:00 p.m.**, for the next Catholic movie night. The movie that evening will be ***The Scarlet and the Black***, which tells the true story of Monsignor Hugh O'Flaherty (Gregory Peck) a courageous Irish Vatican official in Nazi-occupied Rome. He used the Church's neutrality and orchestrated a vast underground network to hide and rescue thousands of Jewish refugees and allied POWs from the Gestapo, leading to a dangerous cat-and-mouse game with Colonel Herbert Kappler (Christopher Plummer) who tried to stop him, but ultimately failed, with O'Flaherty saving lives by defying the Nazis. It is a great drama about moral courage and defiance, showing how one man's bravery can do so much good in the face of evil. Please know that everyone is welcome, but my only fear is that the truckers from our parishes will not like this movie, because it has no trailers. [Feel free to groan].
