***“The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few.”*** The Diocese of Bismarck has indeed been blessed with many vocations to the priesthood. In addition, when we look upon the vocations posters in the back of our churches, we feel doubly blessed that there are many seminarians being formed to serve as future priests for our parishes. But there is a danger in assuming that these numbers will always continue and we can become complacent and not do our part in praying for and encouraging priestly vocations, namely within our own families and parishes. God forbid if the vocations well would dry up, because we relaxed our efforts and quit praying for and promoting vocations for the harvest. The spiritual and pastoral needs of God's people will always be great so our vocational efforts must in turn remain steadfast. The Church relies upon your efforts, prayers, and sacrifices for vocations. Thank you for your labors in the work of God's harvest.

### **The Spiritual Works of Mercy: *Counsel the Doubtful***

Scriptural references: Matthew 13:18-23; Mark 4:13-20, 9:14-29; Luke 8:11-15; and John 14:27

A basic definition: It is an act of love to help others to be certain about what they should do to love and serve God. Many souls could be saved if Catholics would make the effort to speak the Truth in love to their neighbors.

Applications: 1) Respond to cynicism, skepticism, and doubts with hope.

2) Work in our own lives at being optimistic and avoiding cynicism.

3) Ask people about their hopes and support them in trying to achieve them.

4) Be grounded in the spiritual life, Church teaching, and basic dogmatic and doctrinal truths so that you can assist others with their spiritual and theological doubts.

5) Assure lost souls that God the Father has never abandoned them, even despite grave sins they may have committed. He wants them to return to Him so that they can experience once again His great love for them.

6) Assure people that in confusing times, they will find clarity and answers in the Church, who speaks for and with Jesus Christ.

### **Why Go to Mass... It's Summer!**

Summer mornings are the best, with the birds singing, the smell of clover wafting through the air, and the sun bathing us in light and warmth. It is a pity that we would have to give this all up to go to Sunday Mass and be locked indoors. Why not just pray at home and be at one with God's creation, bypassing the local parish church? Well, praying at home is good, but it is not enough. Private prayer is necessary in one spiritual life, but it cannot take the place of the Holy Mass. When you pray at home, prayer is personal and one-dimensional. But when you come to the Holy Mass, you pray with your entire being. You use all your senses; you hear, smell, taste, and touch. You use your body in genuflecting, sitting, kneeling, standing, walking, and singing. The Holy Mass also includes the opportunity to: seek forgiveness for your sins; learn how God's holy Word impacts your life by way of the

homily; offer yourself to the Lord; experience the miracle of bread and wine being changed into the Body and Blood of Christ; reach out to others with the peace of Christ and seek reconciliation; receive the profound blessing of the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist; and be commissioned to make the world a better place in the coming week. Can you do all the above on your deck on a Sunday morning? No, for the above realities can only be experienced at your local parish church within the context of the Holy Mass. Praying at home is not enough to meet your spiritual needs, especially the greatest spiritual need... to receive Christ into one's soul by way of Holy Communion so as one day to be received into the glory of Heaven. With all of this in mind, I hope to see you at Mass this summer.

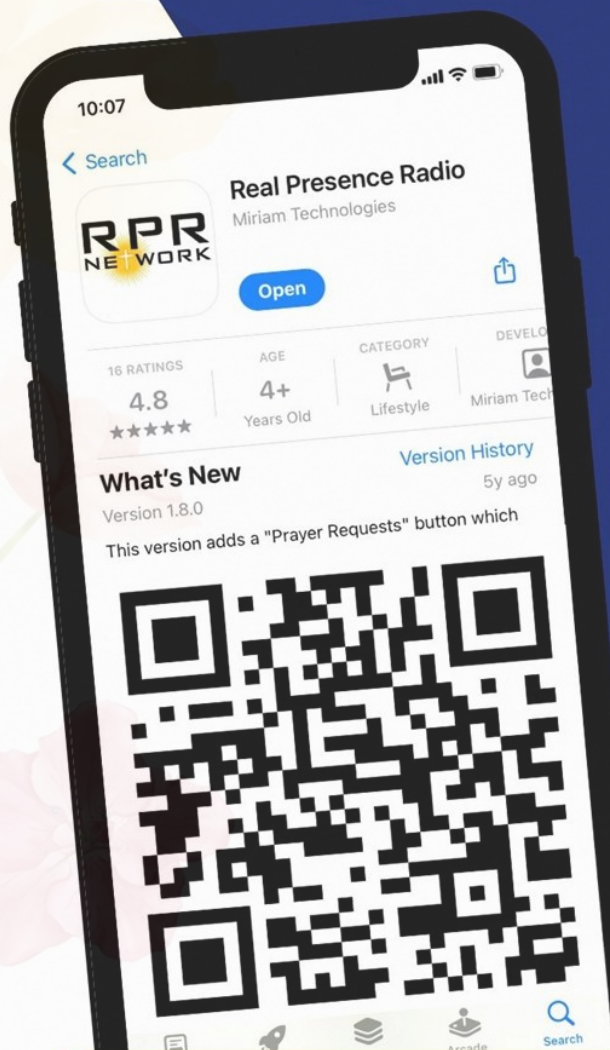
